Dividend Paid By Waccamaw Bank

Executive Vice President J. N. Coburn Releases Information On Payment To Institution's Stockholders

J. N. Coburn, Executive Vice President, today announced that checks are being mailed to approximately 200 stockholders of the Waccamaw Bank and Trust Company covering the fourth quarterly dividend of 50c per share in 1949. This makes a total of \$2.00 per share pair to stockholders this year.

This dividend, which aggregates \$10,000, is payable on or before December 20th to stockholders of record as of December 10, 1949.

Mr. Coburn states that the capital accounts of the bank now total about \$1,150,000.00 in addition to reserves of approximately \$200,000.00.
