KILLING BY OWNER OF GAME PRESERVE-The owner and keeper PRESERVE—The owner and keeper of an enclosed game reserve, who raises deer, pheasants and grouse, for use or sale, shall not be prevented from killing, selling and using those raised or kept in said enclosure. This section applies to the counties of Ashe, Chatham, Davidson, Forsyth, Guilford, Montgomery, Moore, Randolph, Richmond, Rockingham, Scotland, Stanly, Stokes, Surry, Wautauga, Wilkes and Yadkin.

NETTING—The netting of quail or partridges in Davidson or Randolph is a violation of the law, and the punishment is 30 days imprisonment of \$50.00 fine.

NON-RESIDENTS, HUNTING NETTING-The netting of quail

NON-RESIDENTS, HUNTING WITHOUT LICENSE-If any non-resident shall hunt in the State without license, as required by law, or shall hunt upon the lands of au-other without his written consent, or shall fail to carry his license with him in hunting, or shall fail upon demand to exhibit it to any game warden or police officer, he shall be guilty of a misdemeanor. Each day's hunting without license, as required by law,

Carolina, before being allowed to hunt in Handolph County, shall first pay to the Clerk of the Super-ior Court of said County an annual ior Court of said County an annual liceuse tax of ten dollars, and the said Clerk of the Superior Court, upon the payment of the said liceuse tax, shall issue to the said non-resident a liceuse. Any non-resident person hunting in Randolph County without first paying said liceuse tax and obtaining and obtaining a license shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction shall be fined not more than fifty dollars, or imprisoned not more than thirty days.
