Arrangements have just been completed whereby the State Sanato-rium, Sanatorium, N. C., will be able to furnish, free of charge, to any physician in the State a sufficient amount of tuberculin for the Van Pirquet di-agnostic test for tuberculosis. The The

tuberculin will be kept in capillary tubes, each tube to hold enough for one test, and will be sent by mail, one or more at a time, to any physician in the State who will report to the Sanatorium, within a week, the results of the test. Complete directions for making the test will be sent with each tube. This test for the presence of tuberculosis is also called the skin test and is done much like vaccination for smallpox, except it causes no sore on the arm.
