### CORRUPT PRACTICES BILL.

Why This Excellent Democratic Measure Was Defeated.

Even that high Republican authority the New York Tribune is troubled over the failure of congress to pass the Tillman bill prohibiting corporations from contributing money in connection with elections. While Mr. Roosevelt and Mr. Cannon could have pushed this bill through the house in less than an hour they refused to do so. The Tribune warned these gentlemen against resisting the passage of the bill, but in vain. On June 17 it said: "This is a reform which public opinion demands, and there is no good reason why it should not have its first trial in the approaching congressional campaign. Delay in legislating against corrupt practices will only suggest evasion, and such a charge will prove embarrassing to meet in the present temper of the voters."

Let it not be forgotten that the measure failed because it was obstructed by President Roosevelt and Speaker Cannon. And when the president goes out on his preaching tours at the expense of Democrats as well as Republicans ask him why he stifled the corrupt practices bill; why he keeps Cortelyou in his cabinet; why he doesn't apologize to Judge Parker for the falsehood he told about Parker in 1904 and why he doesn't make Cortelyou and Bliss pay back to the policy holders of the life insurance companies the money filched from them in the last campaign. Teddy is a fine preacher, but "words are good when backed up by deeds, and only so."
