## COUNTY COMMENCMENT TO BE HELD APRIL 14

INTERESTING CONTESTS WILL BE WITNESSED

Outline of Program Arranged For Big Educational Event to Be Held in Brevard.

The Transylvania county commencement will be held at Brevard on Friday of next week. The speaker selected for the address of the occasion is unavoidably prevented from being present. The county superintendent is endeavoring to secure some one else, and doubtless a good speaker will be secured.

Some of the features of the commencement exercises will be a contest in spelling by sixth and seventh grade pupils, a recitation contest between seventh grade girls, declamation and recitation contests between high school pupils, commencement address, field sports consisting of a yard dash, 100-yard dash, relay dash, shot put, potato race, broad jump, high jump, etc. In the field sports two boys from each school will be admitted. Prizes will be awarded to the winner in each number. In each number five points will be given to the first three to the second and one to the third. The winner in the highest number of points will be the winning school. Five dollar gold medals will be given to the winner in all declamation, recitation and spelling contests. Essays will be read by those winning in the contests for the first and second prizes given by Row, Peterson & Co. and the medal given by the University Music will be furnished by the Messrs. Johnson and others.

## HENRY ORR CHARGED WITH SHOOTING HENRY CANTRELL

Arrest made Wednesday Morning on Boylston by Henderson County Officers; Wounds not Serious.

Sheriff Drake of Henderson county called on the sheriff's office of Transylvania county Monday night for help in searching for and arresting Henry Orr, charged with having shot Henry Cantrell in the Bowman's Bluff section.

Deputy Sheriff Hume Harris left with Dan Merrill in an automobile to help in the search in the direction outlined by Sheriff Drake and did not return until 1 o'clock Wednesday morning. His hunt didn't take him to the place of the other officers. Sheriff Drake reported to him that Mr. Orr was seen riding a mule and armed with a rifle after the shooting. No details of the affair were learned by Deputy Harris.

Dr. Bill Lyday is said to have dressed the wounds of Mr. Cantrell. The News this received a communication from the Boylston section where the arrest was made, giving an account of the affair. It says that the arrest was made on Wednesday, April 4, but the 4th was Tuesday. The report follows: "The Sheriff from Hendersonville and three other men surrounded C. S. Smathers' home Wednesday morning and searched the house and awoke Henry Orr from his slumber and arrested him.

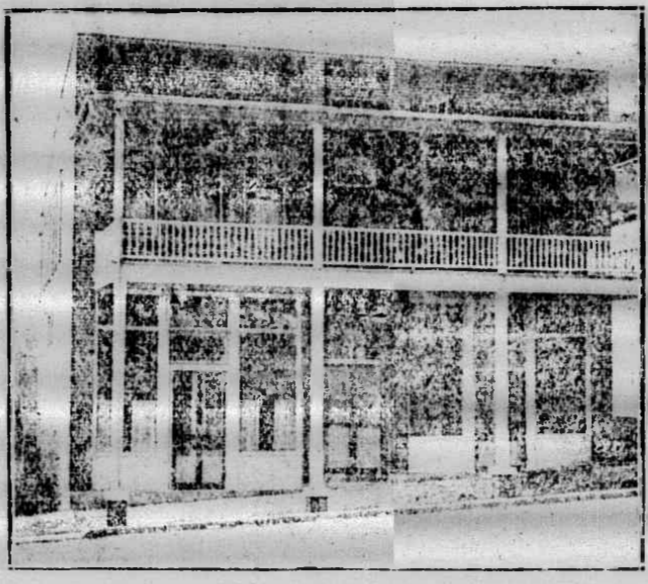

## TRANSYLVANIA FARMERS MAKE GOOD PROGRESS

LIST OF THOSE BUYING MODERN FARM TOOLS

Full Car Load of Farm Implements adds Page to Agricultural Thrift of the County.

"Don't Order," C. Doyle. The foregoing is a brief, innocent-looking exhortation with which every Sylvania Valley news reader is thoroughly familiar.

It sounds a little queer to the stranger but when its importance dawns upon the reader, it immediately sees that C. M. Doyle of the Brevard Hardware company is endeavoring to solve the man-order business in this section by requesting prospective mail order patrons to see him for prices before ordering.

This persistent advertising campaign of the Brevard Hardware company has meant a good deal for Transylvania in discouraging mail order business and it has doubtless meant a great deal in the way of agricultural progress for the county, as was gathered from a page advertisement in the News last week telling of the expected arrival of a car load of farm implements, said to be the first solid car load ever shipped into Transylvania.

Knowing that the purchasers of this machinery stand in the vanguard of agricultural progress in this section the News has secured from Mr. Doyle their names and addresses with a list of implements placed for the planting, cultivating and reaping of this year's crop. They are the "who's who" of Transylvania farmers.

These tools are made by the International Harvester company, whose representative, H. H. Compton, recently joined Mr. Doyle in a canvass of the greater part of the county.

This car of implements arrived this week.

Listed with the tools therein is an oil tractor Mogul 8-15, the gang plow of which cuts 28 inches, recently placed by Mr. Doyle. This machine was purchased by James Oneal Cantrell of Island Ford. Miss Mary Galloway of Calvert has in the order an 8-h.p. oil engine, grist mill and corn crusher.

There are a few tools, including disc harrows, drag harrows, orain separators, mowers and a two-horse planter, not yet placed, but the following have been sold:
