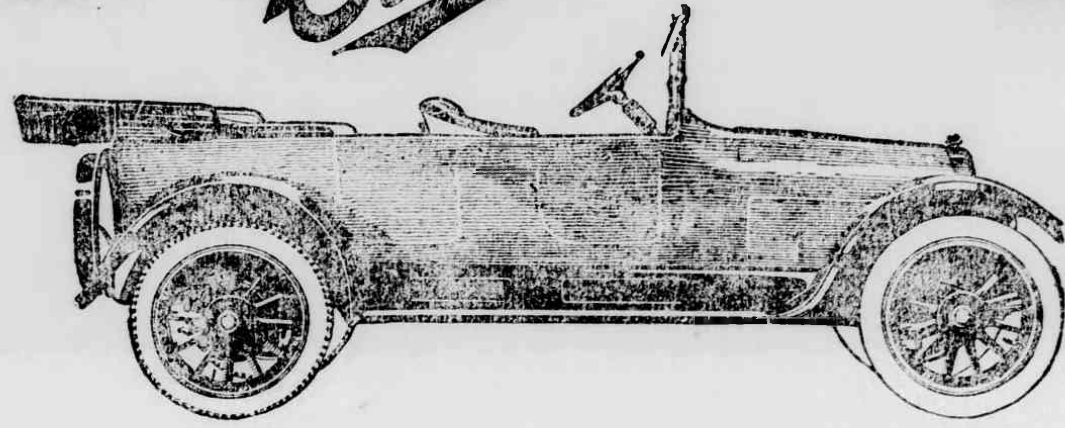

**SOUTHERN COMMERCIAL CONGRESS
CONVENTION IN NORFOLK, VA.**

An Event of Unusual Importance
Not Only to The South But
to The United States As Well:
Dec. 11th to 14th, 1916.

The theme of this congress will be "The Changed Outlook" or "International Reconstruction Resulting from the European War." Economic, agriculture, military, governmental, financial and commercial subjects will be discussed in the interpretation of the relation of the United States to international reconstruction.

With the close of the European war acute problems will confront the United States. A basic purpose of the Norfolk congress will be to evolve a plan of action with which to meet the new order and the changed conditions.

The program will include addresses by more than one hundred of the most prominent men of the United States and foreign countries, including:

- Hon. Wellington Koo, Minister from China.
- Hon. Robert Lansing, Secretary of State.
- Hon. Josephus Daniels, Secretary of Navy.
- Hon. David F. Houston, Secretary of Agriculture.
- Hon. Wm. C. Redfield, Secretary of Commerce.

The President of the United States is expected.

Co-ordinating Organizations
These will meet at the same time.

Second annual meeting of the House of Southern Governors.

The American Commission on Agricultural Organization.

The National Association of Commissioners of Agriculture.

The Congress has not only been active in building up commercial relations with countries of the Western Hemisphere, but has established definite ties with the Orient.
