It said that Union Co. in the State of Georgia never has grown a bale of cotton, it is in the mountainous section of the State where it can't grow. There are several Co's. in N. C. that would be better off, if they would grow less of the fleecy staple, and more of something for home consumption.

The resignation of Judge H. G. Connor last week, was a surprise, and regretted by many of our people in this section, for he was held in the highest esteem all over the State, and we think he wore the robe of justice while on the bench satisfactorily, and his decisions were firm, yet tempered with kindness. Mr. Jacob Battle was appointed by Gov. Carr as Judge Connor's successor.

The first glass manufactory of the United States, was established by the colonies from Britain, at Jamestown, in the year 1608. Now the progress has so much improved that they even have glass factories, at nearly all the fairs, and even make cases, dresses and other articles of commerce at short notice. The country is almost astonished at the new inventions and rapid growth of the world's progress.

The life of many a person was suddenly taken along the Gulf coast, and about the mouth of the Mississippi River last week by a coast storm the deaths amount to more than two thousand. Ships were wrecked and great damage was done all along the coast for miles and miles. The storm was awful and the correct estimate of damage will be hard to get at. Relief has been sent, and the bodies of the dead were buried on the shores where ever they were found.

During all the talk about gold and its production the output of the mines in Virginia, Georgia and North Carolina must not be lost sight of. The records of the mint show that up to 1891 North Carolina had produced \$21,593,844 of gold, that Georgia had produced \$15,922,260, and that Virginia had produced \$3,189,610. Until 1849, when gold was discovered in California, all the gold of the United States mint came from the Southern States with the exception of \$37,850. In thus computing the gold product of Virginia, North Carolina and Georgia, only the government records are taken, and it cannot be doubted that the total product was greater.—Rome Tribune.

Beet Factories For North Carolina.

Congressman Alexander has been invited to make a visit to the West, which may have a most important result upon the agricultural interests of this State. The German syndicate that owns the beet sugar works in the States of Nebraska, Oregon, California and Utah, have invited him to make a personal inspection of the works, and to look into the manner of the cultivation of the beet. They have their eye on North Carolina as a profitable field for cultivation, and they want to get Mr. Alexander's views. For that reason, they have invited him to make the visit.

They propose, in case he thinks the beet could be profitably grown in this State, to furnish him for distribution to the farmers a ton and a half of seed. Their only condition will be that each farmer will make them a report of the number of pounds of beets grown per acre, and furnish one dozen beets for analysis. If the experiment proves successful, the syndicate guarantees to build any number of beet sugar factories in this State. This would open up an industry that would lay cotton in the shade.
