And it is hereby further declared that the efforts of the government should be steadily directed to the establishment of such a safe system of bi-metalism as will maintain at all times the equal power of every dollar coined or issued by the United States in the markets and in the payment of debts,"

Whether this is the right thing or not we will have to wait and see, but the bill stands ready now to attach any measure that will help the country, and maintain the promises of the Democratic party.




