Senator Ransom will not be a candidate for the vacancy on the United States Circuit Court. So if North Carolina expects any of its legal rights to get the place they should at once unite on the man and urge him.

Congress adjourned on Friday evening and the Extraordinary Session is a thing of history. To day the members will have a month's vacation and meet in December in regular Session.

Senator Jones of Nevada, and Mr. Mahone son of Ex-Senator Mahone of Virginia, have purchased the Montgomery mine at Concord N. C., and they will soon begin digging gold. The ore in that mine is very rich, and is plentiful, our State furnishes a great many metals and lots of gold and silver.

Last Tuesday the elections of several of the Western and North Western States were held. Virginia and Maryland were the only Southern States. Virginia elected the democratic ticket by a majority of from 55,000 to 40,000. New York has gone republican. So has Ohio. Illinois has elected democratic State officers. Massachusetts and Iowa are uncertain yet, but will likely be republicans.

As usual in all the State elections the Populists have cut very small figures. The fight is between the democrats and republicans. The Virginia election was very important to the South, as it would give the Populists the black eye to get defeated after making such a tremendous effort. Tuesday they were defeated, now they will cry out fraud, like they did in our own State after their defeat.

Some time ago the Athletic Club of Auburn, New York, offered purse of \$1000 to any one who would make the trip from New York to New Orleans in seventy days without a cent of money. A Mr. Williams an Athletic young man took the challenge, and on Sunday the 29th. of October he reached Greensboro and was entertained at the Beubow House and that was his 25th. day on the round, he is making 25 to 35 miles per day and will reach his destiny in time to win the wager.

In voting on the repeal bill, Senator Vance was against it and Senator Ransom for. In the House only Mr. Bunn from the 4th District, and Mr. Settle from North Carolina, voted for repeal. Mr. Grady from our district, and all the others in the State were against the measure. Each of those gentlemen are honest in their opinions, if repealing the purchase clause of the Sherman act is what the Nation needed. Mess. Ransom, Bunn and Settle are right, and if it does not work well, and prove a benefit to the country. Mess. Grady, Vance, Branch, and all who voted against the bill are wrong, but we feel that all of those men acted on their honest convictions.

The Repeal Bill has passed the Senate by a Vote of 43 to 32.

On Monday the 30th. of Oct., at about 7 o'clock the final vote on the repeal bill was taken and the result was 43 votes for repeal and 32 against the end came, although everything that could be done to keep from reaching a vote was introduced by opposers of repeal, but the seal has been put on it, either for weal or woe.

the die has been cast and the President signed the bill. We hope that it will be good for the country, anyhow it is carrying out the Chicago Platform, and now men with money will not be left in suspense as to the course of legislation. Confidence we hope will be restored throughout the entire country and the cry of hard times relax.

The bill as passed reads as follows:

"That so much of the act approved July 14, 1890, entitled, 'An act directing the purchase of silver bullion and issue of treasury notes thereon, and for other purposes,' as directs the Secretary of the Treasury to purchase from time to time silver bullion to the aggregate amount of 4,500,000 ounces, or so much thereof as may be offered in each month at the market price thereof, not exceeding \$1 for 371.25 grains of pure silver, and to issue in payment for such purchases treasury notes of the United States, be and the same is hereby repealed. And it is hereby declared to be the policy of the United States to continue the use of both silver and gold as standard money, and to coin both silver and gold into money of equal intrinsic and exchangeable value, such equality to be secured through international agreement or by such safeguards of legislation as will insure the maintenance of the parity in value of the coins of the two metals and the equal power of every dollar at all times in the markets and in the payment of all debts. And it is hereby further declared that the efforts of the government should be steadily directed to the establishment of such a safe system of bimetalism as will maintain at all times the equal power of every dollar coined or issued by the United States in the markets and in the payment of debts."

Whether this is the right thing or not we will have to wait and see, but the bill stands ready now to attach any measure that will help the country, and maintain the promises of the Democratic party.

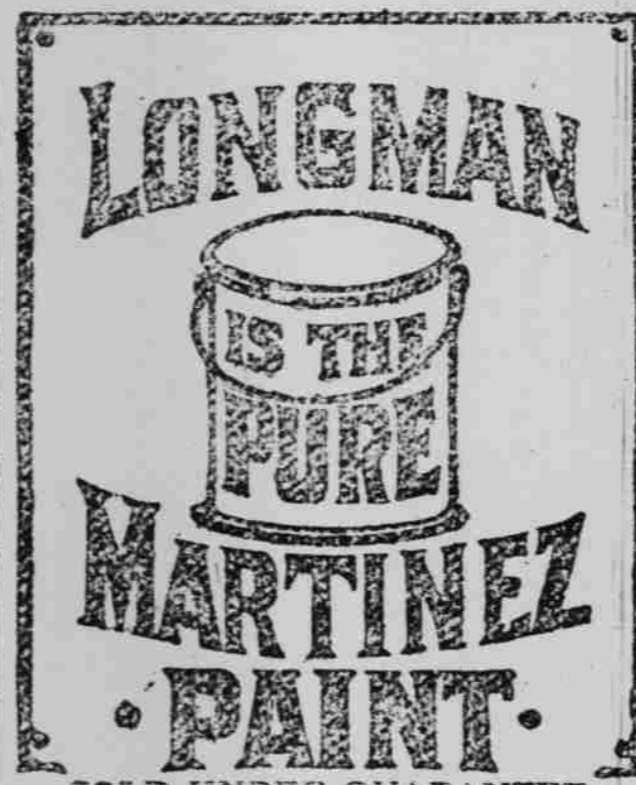
