COMMUNICATION.

MR. EDITOR: I notice a communication in THE UNION in issue of April 14th, written by "A Free Citizen" of Dunn, which item somewhat impressed me. I was not aware that you had any slaves in Dunn. From the inference one would suppose that the writer has knowledge of some slaves in Dunn and he also seems to oppose organization. I think though that he is mistaken in that, as he seems to think that good government for town, state or nation, can not come out of a party that is not mixed as he says that a year ago a mixture set of town commissioners were elected which governed very efficiently and he thinks that to organize the democracy of Dunn would be detrimental to her social and commercial interest.
