The size of the cotton crop last year and the price it was sold at brought enough money to many to enable them to save an adequate amount to buy their groceries and guanos this year for cash. But they did not save it. We are told by many in honest confession that they recklessly bought this and that they could have done without and felt no discomfort thereby. The consequence is that they have occasion to lament their folly in the light of the size and price of the cotton crop they are now marketing. A full crop next year can leave no net earning, for it will take all clear gains to pay up losses sustained this year. The wisest course is for the farmer to resolve firmly that he will accumulate enough over current needs to pay cash for his fertilizers and groceries. A life of mortgaging crops in advance, as is the custom, affects the very manhood of our people, and along with this evil is a long train, such as impaired energies, dissipated aspirations and temptations to dishonesty. —Lumber Bridge News.
