At the last meeting of the Fish eries Commission Board held at Morehead City, N. C., on the 5th day of July 1917, a motion was offered as follows:

"That the closed season for shad and herring shall be from April 20th to January 1st, during which time it shall be unlawful to catch with any net, seine or other appliance, any shad or herring in the waters of North Caroline. "


