Water Pageant To Be Camp Carolina Event Thursday

One of the outstanding events of the summer season will be the water pageant to be staged by the American Red Cross Life Saving Institute at Camp Carolina Lake on Thursday evening of this week. People of Brevard and the surrounding sections are invited to attend the fête for which no charge will be made.

The elaborate program beginning at 8 p. m. will have a cast of nearly one hundred people, the use of two ships each capable of carrying twenty men, and a castle of equal number to take care of an equal number. Lighting effects and other property units from the beautiful Carolina Lake front will add to the splendour of the scene.

Story as depicted by the pageant, known as "Hucanoeers of Carolina," is the capture of a pirate band of Gypsies of Princess Ivaldo from the castle of King Ferdinand, her life on an unknown island for two years, and final rescue for the captain of a great ship who is her lover.
