ROSMAN, Feb. 7-Clyde Mosely, 22, died at Lyday Memorial hospital in Brevard Monday morning at five o'clock, death resulting from injuries received in an automobile accident on Sunday afternoon. Elzie Ellenburg, of Creet, S. C., was absolved of blame in connection with the young man's death Monday afternoon, the jury returning a verdict that the de-ceased came to his death in an unavoidable automobile accident.
