



DIES AT AGE OF 76 YEARS**

Mr. William Alexander Padgett, a prominent citizen and farmer of the Union section, after an illness of several weeks from kidney trouble passed away at the home of his daughter, Mrs. Samuel Hamrick on last Thursday evening at 7 o'clock and the funeral services were conducted from Union Baptist church Friday at 12 o'clock by his pastor, Rev. W. W. Washburn, in the presence of a large concourse of sorrowing relatives and friends.

The deceased was born November 18th, 1845, and was therefore 76 years and ten months old when the final summons came.

His faithful wife preceded him to the great beyond about 15 years ago, leaving only one daughter, Mrs. Hamrick with whom he had made his home since that time. He was a valiant Confederate soldier, serving in the cavalry under Wheeler's command.

Beside his daughter he is survived by two grandchildren, six great grandchildren and one brother Burwell Padgett, two sisters, Miss Jane Padgett and Mrs. Julian Vauger all of whom live in Ark.—Shelby Star.
