The Vote Proves It.

In the election of 1896 the city of Louisville gave McKinley 29,107 votes and Bryan 17,695. It was claimed then by all the Democrats, and not seriously denied, that the election officers, (the Democrats were denied officers, Palmer and Buckner men being appointed) had stolen at least 5,000 votes from Bryan.

Time at last sets all things even." The recent election affords proof of the 1896 revolt. This year the Democratic revolt against Goebel was greater in Louisville than anywhere else in the State, twice as many Democrats being opposed to him as were opposed to Bryan. The election is admitted to have been fair, the Democrats contending only that the presence of military at the polls intimidated voters and prevented Goebel's getting his full vote. The vote as cast stood: For Taylor, 18,940; for Goebel, 15,023; for Brown, 3,672.

This shows that McKinley's vote in 1896 was counted ten thousand votes more than were honestly cast. Every mouth discloses some of the frauds practiced in 1896.—News and Observer.
