**RESOLUTION ORDERING SPECIAL ELECTION IN BEAUFORT GRADED SCHOOL DISTRICT:**

Whereas in pursuance of the provisions of Chapter 136 of the Public Laws of North Carolina, 1923 as amended by Chapter 121 of the Public Laws of North Carolina, Extra Session, 1924, the Board of Trustees of Beaufort Graded School have petitioned for a special election to be held under the provisions of the laws above referred to for the purpose of voting upon the question of issuing bonds in the maximum sum of \$100,000.00 and levying a sufficient tax for the payment thereof, for the purpose of acquiring, erecting, enlarging, altering and equipping school buildings, and purchasing sites in said school district; and whereas, upon investigation the petition is found and determined to be in all respects in conformity with the requirements of the laws aforesaid.

Therefore, be it resolved: That the said special election be, and the same hereby is, authorized and ordered for the purpose set forth in the above named petition; that the time for holding the said election shall be Tuesday, March 17th, 1925, between the hours of sunrise and sunset; that the place for holding the said election shall be at the City Hall; that for the purpose of holding the said election, T. S. Martin shall be, and is hereby, appointed registrar, and Mr. M. R. Springle and Mrs. Maude Chadwick poll holders.

Be it further resolved, that notice of the said special election shall be given by publication at least three times (once a week for three consecutive weeks) in the Beaufort News, a newspaper published and circulating in the said school district, and that the first publication thereof shall be at least thirty days before the said 17th day of March, 1925, and by notice for the same length of time at some other public place in the said district.

Be it further resolved, that a new registration of the the qualified voters of the said Beaufort Graded School District be, and same hereby is, ordered; and that notice of said new registration shall be given by publication at least one time in the Beaufort News aforesaid at least twenty days before the close of the registration books; that such published notice of registration shall state the days on which the books will be open for registration of voters, and the place where the books will be open on Saturdays; that the books of such new registration shall close on the second Saturday before the election, and that the Saturday before the said special election shall be Challenge Day.

Be it further resolved that at the election those who are in favor of the issuance of the said bonds and the levying of a sufficient tax for the payment of the same shall vote a ticket on which shall be printed or written the words, "For the issuance of \$100,000.00 School Bonds and the levying of a tax for the payment thereof," and those who are opposed shall vote a ticket on which shall be printed or written the words, "Against the issuance of \$100,000.00 School Bonds and the levying of a tax for the payment thereof."
