TO THE TAX-PAYERS OF CARTERET COUNTY.

List Takers have been appointed for the different townships in the county to list the real and personal property for taxes for the year 1925. 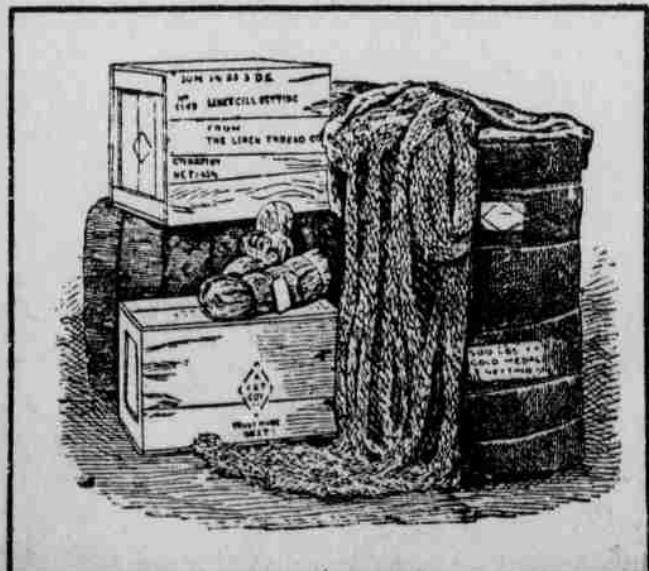
