NEWS ITEMS FROM STATE CAPITAL

liveries of 28 percent on ginnings thus far this season; Judge Meekins in Federal court held up the sale of the property of the Fisheries Products Company, which "stung" hundreds of North Carolinians pending a hearing of stockholders in the matter; and the state college extension workers met to plan their work for the ensuing year. Australians are writing into North Carolina to find out about the state's method of raising poultry, etc.

It is stated that something like fifteen percent of the Freshmen entering State College this year expect to work their way through practical-half of these being entirely dependent upon this plan of paying expenses. The annual fair of the students will this year be held during the week of the State Fair. It is announced that Mrs. Gutzon Borglum, wife of the famous sculptor who claims to be the originator of the Stone Mountain Confederate Memorial is to have charge of the art section of the Fine Arts Department of the Raleigh Woman's Club for the coming "club year." Slogan: "Art should not be for the few any more than liberty is for the few."

The North Carolina trucking industry is showing up well this season according to estimates given to the public by the division of markets, State Department of Agriculture, which places the number of car loads of fruit and truck shipped out at 17,355. of Irish potatoes alone there were 6,634 cars of strawberries, 2,946 cars. The remaining 7,775 cars were laden with watermelons, cabbage, lettuce, sweet potatoes, dewberries apples, green peas, string beans, cucumbers, cantaloupe, green corn, beets carrots, peppers, tomatoes, turnips and spinach.

Twenty nine lives were snuffed out in automobile accidents during the month of August says a report issued by the bureau of vital statistics, State Board of Health, and ninety-six from violent causes. There were 22 accidental drownings, 19 homicides, 11 died in railroad accidents and 10 persons were burned to death.

The defense in the Cole murder case at Rickingham is expected to offer a plea of self-defense, Congressman Clyde Hoey, of Shelby, has been employed by the prosecution and the case is to be hard fought. Attorneys for both sides have recently held conferences. The trial will start on Monday September 28.

In an automobile accident near Athens, Georgia, on Sunday morning of last week Chas. M. Upham, chief engineer of the North Carolina State Highway Commission, was seriously injured but is on the road to recovery. Other North Carolinians injured were Fred E. Schnepfe, fourth district engineer, and W. E. Hawkins, construction engineer, both of whom have been released from the hospital.

The Theft Bureau of the State Automobile License Department recovered fifty-eight missing cars last month, thirty-nine of them being Fords. Thirty-four Ford and five "Automobiles were stolen during this period.

The State's Prison has perfected plans for the construction of a new group of stockades at Caledonia Farm in Halifax county to cost around \$35,000. This is considered a move in the right direction. The farm at Caledonia consists of something near 6,000 acres of which 4,500 are being cultivated. The new stockades will accommodate 600 prisoners.

The State Highway Commission reports the laying of eighty-four miles of paving during August, as follows: Concrete 38.22; asphaltic concrete, 17.26 miles; sand asphalt, 8.63 miles; concrete base, 20.12 miles. Route Ten extending from Beaufort to Murphy, a distance of 579 miles, has approximately 500 miles of "paved" road already.

The North Carolina Orphan Association will hold its annual meeting with Superintendent Barnes, of the Methodist Orphanage, Raleigh, on Wednesday, September 30. Hon. Josephus Daniels, Dr. W. S. Rankin and other prominent Tar Heels will speak.

Secretary Wilson, of the Tri-State Tobacco Growers' Co-operative Association, announces that more than 15,000,000 pounds of the weed have already been delivered from the South Carolina and Eastern North Carolina crops this season. 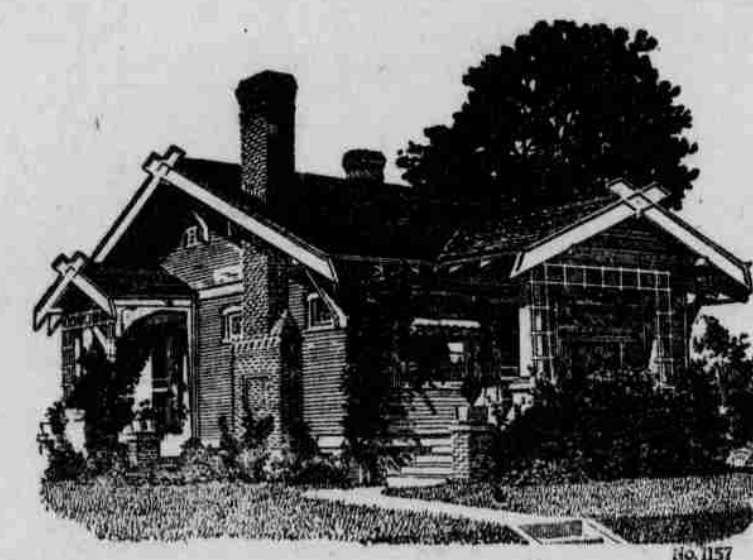
