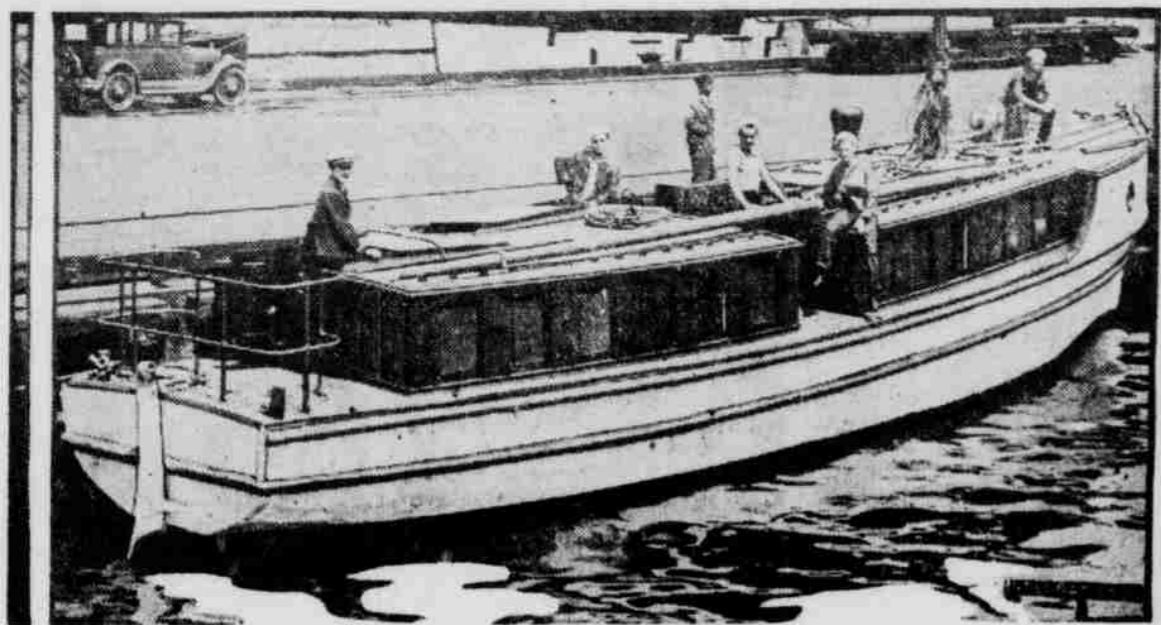


Launch for Rock Island Unit of Naval Reserves



This United States navy launch, fitted with auxiliary sails, has been equipped at the Brooklyn navy yard preparatory to being taken on an 1,800-mile inland trip to be used by the Rock Island (Ill.) unit of the naval reserve. Lieut. Roy L. Barker and a crew of six were detailed to take the boat through the Erie canal, the Great Lakes, the Chicago drainage canal and the Illinois river to Rock Island.

CONVICT PUGILIST READY FOR FIGHT

Inmate of Penitentiary Will Meet Middleweight Champion Friday Night

RALEIGH, June 20—(INS)—Charley Mangum, the "fighting prisoner," is working hard today for his coming fight that may net him a mythical title.

The only inmate of a state prisoner ever to go in for professional boxing Mangum is slated to meet Terry Roberts, middleweight champion of the Carolinas, on the night of June 24.

It probably will be the first time in ring history that a prisoner ever has tried to gain any sort of title while confined behind prison walls.

Mangum is doing hard training each night, sparring with his partners, Gallagher and Kid Turner, the latter a giant black from Boston.

This will be the closing ring card for the present season at the penitentiary and Mangum will be given a rest until next fall.

Other bouts on the card call for Charley Hauser of Fort Bragg and Bennie Mack of Charlotte to sling gloves at each other for eight rounds to settle their old argument which had its inception when this pair battled through ten rounds to a draw. Tommie Gallagher, lightweight champ of the Carolinas will exchange wallops with Jess Lasgo of Charlotte, two negro bantams yet to be selected will put on the first bout of the evening and there probably will be a battle royal to start off the night's entertainment.

It is evident, at any rate, that the females learned to regard a racket-tailed suitor as specially desirable, otherwise the "fashion" would have died out.

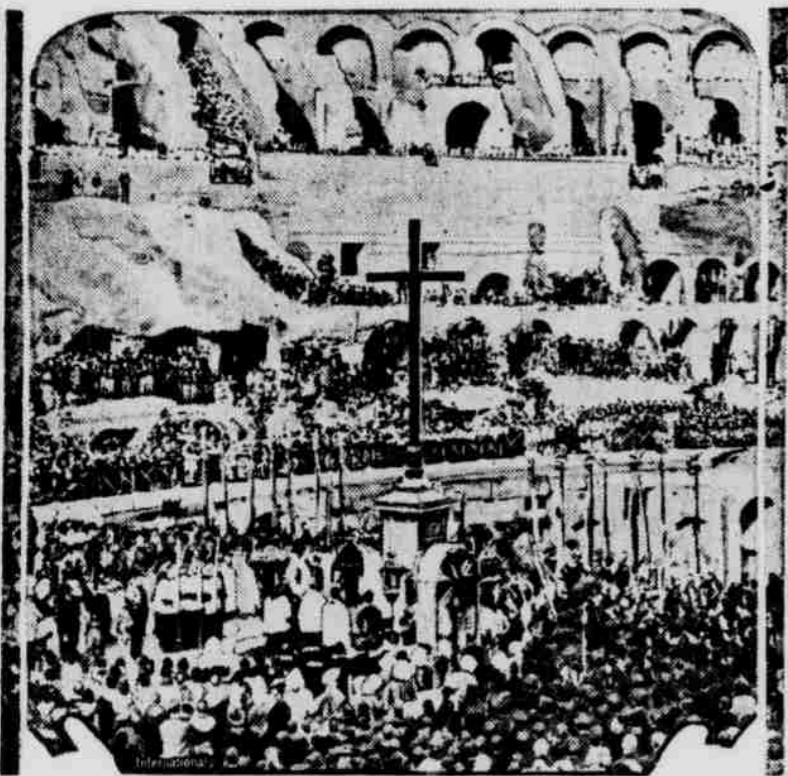

Many Dogs Listed In North Carolina

RALEIGH, N. C., June 18—(INS)—Regardless of whether or not you have your share of the per capita wealth of the nation, you own \$7.73 worth of property if you have a dog.

More than a half million dollars worth of dogs are listed for taxation in North Carolina according to the most recent report of the state revenue department.

The canines numbering 68,904, are valued at \$532,536, an average value of approximately \$7.73.

Sampson county leads all others in the state insofar as dogs are concerned, with 7,610 of the four legged "pals" listed for taxation. Then comes Wake county, with 3,571, and Davidson is third with 3,425.

Has the department "got" your goat? There are 19,469 goats listed, with a valuation of \$31,692. Brunswick with 1,924; Gates, with 1,124, and Randolph, with 1,009, respectively, lead all other counties in the state in the number of goats listed.

In one week, county agent E. F. 205 hogs worth 2,550 in an effort to help eradicate hog cholera in the county.

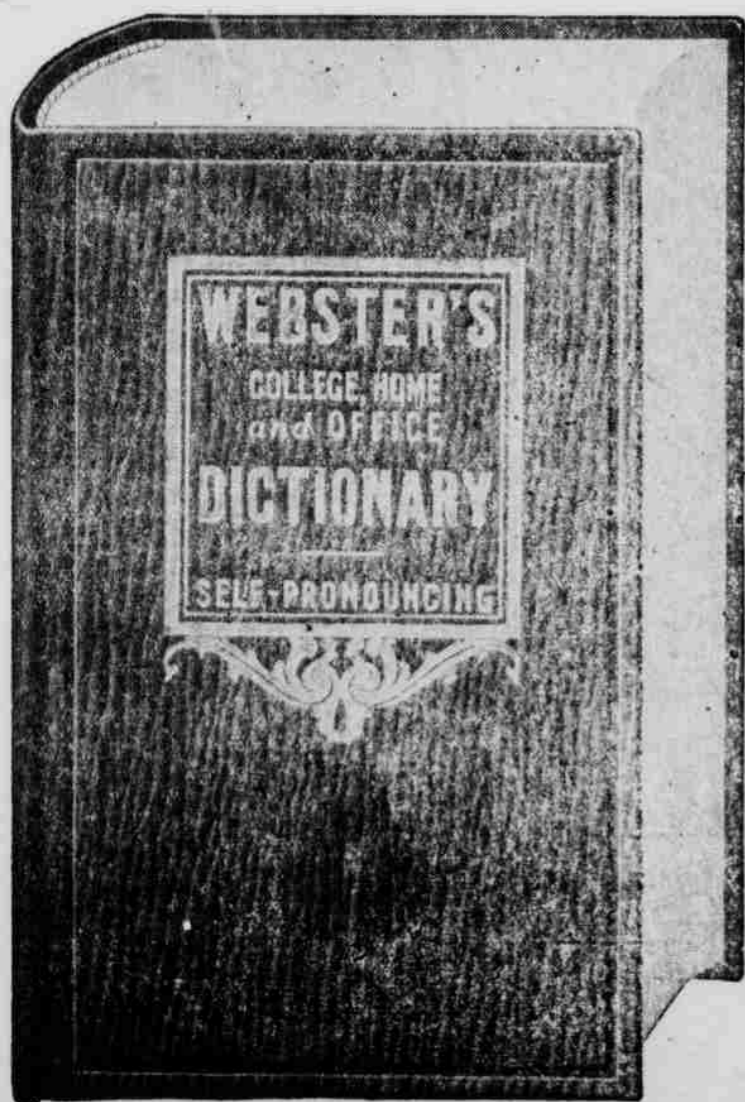
