Powers plead guilty to the charge against him and Judge Hill gave him six months in jail to be worked on the roads of any county in the district and required him to pay the costs. Solicitor Duncan asked to have it recorded in the judgment that Powers is not to enjoy any special liberties but must stay in the jail at night unless sent out of the county. This was done.

Elijah Blount Fulcher was convicted of stealing a short gun valued at \$6.75 from a boy by the name of Martin Luther Willis. Officers Seth Hughts and Iredell Salter searched his house and found the gun in a loft above the ceiling. Fulcher went on the stand and told a long tale about finding the gun in a swamp. This did not impress the Judge greatly though it appeared and so he said eight months and the costs for the defendant.

John Lee, Negro, was tried on the charge of breaking into the store of Simon Martinos at Newport and stealing goods to the value of \$500. Sheriff Davis searched the house recovered several hundred dollars worth of merchandise said to have been stolen from the Martinos store. Lee did not go on the stand but it is understood that he denies stealing the goods although admits that they were stolen. He was bound over to Superior Court under a \$500 bond.

Five defendants plead guilty to the charge of playing a small game of poker, penny ante they said, and judgment was suspended on payment of costs. They were Cecil Dennis, Ben Harrison, John Guthrie, J. W. Guthrie Jr., F. Scotty, M. Kato.

Mrs. E. S. Martin and children spent the day last Monday with her father.

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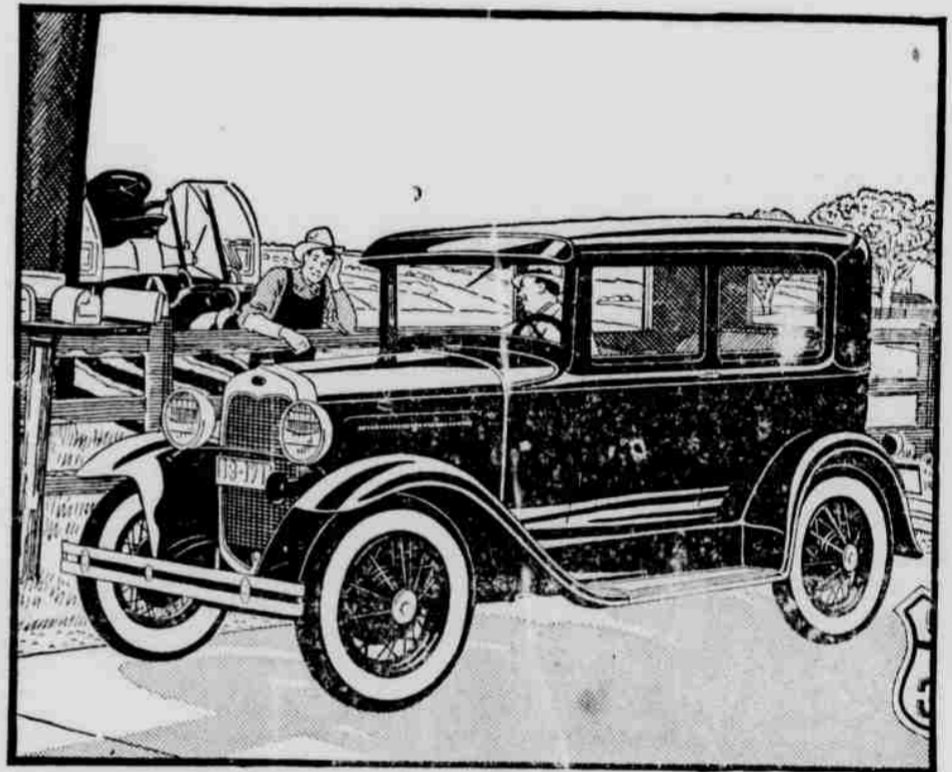
