LEGAL NOTICE

Proposals will be received upon sealed bids at the office of the Local Government Commission in Raleigh by said Commission, on or after five days after publication of this Legal Notice, for all or any part of five hundred thousand dollars of Notes of Carteret County, North Carolina, bearing interest at the rate of six per centum per annum, and to be dated and to mature as may be later determined in accordance with the County Finance Act as amended. The total amount of such notes shall not exceed the amount stated, but any part of said amount may be issued for maintenance of the Constitutional school term and for necessary expenses or debt service, either in anticipation of taxes and other revenue, or in anticipation of Funding Bonds authorized.

There will be no auction. Bidders must present with their bids a certified check upon an incorporated bank or trust company for one-half of one per centum of the notes bid for, the purpose of such check being to secure the unit against any loss resulting from the failure of the bidder to

comply with the terms of his bid. The said notes may be in any denominations desired and may be issued at any time within twelve months from date of publication of this Notice, to-wit, the twenty-first day of May, 1931.

BOND ORDER.

BE IT RESOLVED, By the Board of Commissioners for the County of Carteret, State of North Carolina:

(a) That negotiable coupon bonds of said county registerable as to principal, shall be issued under authority of County Finance Act and other statutes applicable, for the special purpose of funding or refunding valid indebtedness of said county.

(b) That the maximum aggregate principal amount of said bonds shall be \$800,000.00.

(c) That a tax sufficient to pay principal and interest of said bonds as same fall due, shall be annually levied and collected.

(d) That a statement of debt of said county has been filed with the Clerk and is open to public inspection, and the County Auditor is hereby designated as the proper official to file said statement and same as filed is hereby approved.

(e) That this order shall take effect on its passage and shall not be submitted to the voters.

The foregoing Order has been introduced and a sworn statement has been filed under the county finance act showing the assessed valuation of the county to be \$14,292,668, and the net debt for other than school purposes including the proposed bonds to be \$3,439,450, and the net debt for school purposes including the proposed bonds to be \$391,700. A tax will be levied for the payment of the proposed bonds and interest, if the same shall be issued. Any citizen or taxpayer may protest against the issuance of such bonds at a meeting of the board of county commissioners to be held at two o'clock P. M., Monday June 1, 1931, or an adjournment thereof.

These proposals will be considered by the Board immediately thereafter, and should an acceptable proposal be received and approved by the Board, then this acceptable proposal and the question of selling the Light and Waterworks utilities will be submitted to the voters of said City of Beaufort as soon as practicable thereafter.

Each proposal will be on forms supplied by the City and will state the highest cash price offered for the utilities. In addition to this price, each bidder will specify in detail the exact amount to be charged for all City services on lights and water, the form of franchise and schedule of rates for water and light services to be effective.

A certified check on some well-known bank in an amount of not less than Five Thousand (\$5,000.00) Dollars, made payable to the Treasurer of the City of Beaufort without recourse, will accompany each bid to apply on the purchase price and assure carrying out of the terms of the proposal.

Preference will be given to proposals on the forms supplied by the City; however, alternate proposals will be considered and analyzed.

The City reserves the right to reject any or all bids, or to accept such bid as appears to be to the best interests of the City.

OFFICIALS ASKED TO REPORT CASH ON HAND

Raleigh, June 2—Charles M. Johnson, director of Local Government, has sent out notices to officials of all counties, cities, towns and local tax districts, asking for a report on the amount of money on deposit in banks of sinking fund cash and cash of current funds, as of May 31, 1931, asking that the reports be filed not later than June 15. This is one of the sections of the new Local Government Law which provides for strict handling of public money by officers of the local units.

Carteret County Taxes Must Be Paid

The Board of Commissioners with approval of Local Government Commission at Raleigh, is refinancing the indebtedness of the County.

No new debt is being created. The new Bonds or Notes are solely to pay present existing debts and get them on a basis of payments so they can be met in the future.

The refinancing will result in smaller requirements for debt service for the next three years, than at present, and thus reduce the burden on the taxpayers, and at the same time will fund into bonds all present floating debts.

The tax levy for the coming year will be reduced. The present total levy is \$2.30 and is has not been sufficient to meet the needs. The new levy will be considerably under \$2.00 and will be ample to meet all obligations PROVIDED IT IS COLLECTED.

The new fiscal year begins July 1, 1931. Under new laws, the County is authorized to employ a special tax collector, and on that day all unpaid taxes, will be put in his hands for collection.

In the meantime, during the month of June, there is an urgent need to collect past due taxes, in order to meet current expenses.

Hence every taxpayer in the County, who owes taxes for the year now ending, or for any previous year, is called upon to promptly settle these taxes, so that the payments may appear in the collections before June 30.

This is vitally important in connection with the refinancing, and in order to be able to reduce the tax levy for the coming year.
