FARMERS WILL WATCH NEXT GENERAL ASSEMBLY

By F. H. Jeter
RALEIGH, Sept. 5—The North Carolina farmer is deeply concerned in what the next General Assembly will do to help him in the way of tax reduction.
This was the significant statement

made by W. Warren Watson of Hyde County, president of the State Farmers Convention, in his opening address to the convention delegates at State College on Tuesday morning, August 30.

"It appears to me," said Mr. Watson, "that we should give consideration to those matters and things vitally affecting the State generally for they will surely affect the agricultural interests which represent 52 per cent of the State's industry. It is being generally understood that the personnel of the incoming General Assembly is, by a good majority, favorable to the repeal of the ad valorem tax for the six months school term. Now that the State has taken over the roads and the schools, then why not the State assume the debts contracted by the various counties for the building of roads which are now an integral part of the State Highway system."

Mr. Watson also advocated the State assuming the burden of debt incurred by counties and special school districts in building State-regulated types of school buildings. He said further the State should take over the various road and bridge bond issues where the money had been legally and lawfully expended for certain roads. As to salary cuts, he declared this should be done evenly and that if the General Assembly should create any new offices, the officer employed should be subject to such a cut as well as the lowliest employee.

The further consolidation and centralization of all bureaus, commissions and offices should be effected in the various counties and the state government, in an effort to save tax money in this emergency, he said.

B. TAYLOR HILL HAS CAR ACCIDENT FRIDAY MORNING

A car in which several Morehead City youths were riding Friday morning westward on Ann Street was run in by a Ford coach driven by B. Taylor Hill as it was entering Ann from Craven Street going northward. The Beaufort youth said that he did not see the approaching car, but said that it was his fault. The Morehead City automobile was damaged somewhat and all of its occupants were whirled and shaken up, while one youth by the name of Woodcock re-

ceived a bad laceration on his right hip. He was taken to the Potter Emergency Hospital where he received treatment.

In orchards where legume cover crops have been used, the trees are in better shape and there is less dying back than usual, reports E. H. Garrison, county agent of Moore County.

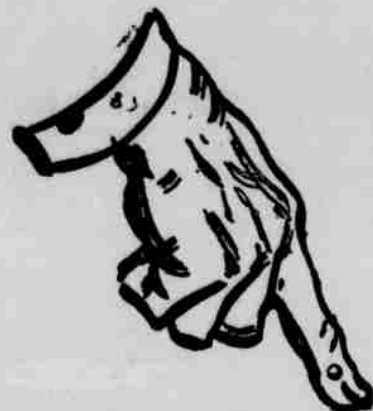
