Carraway of Merrimon, who entered the United States Marine Corps last November, has completed the basic training course at the Marine Barracks, Parris Island, S. C., and has been transferred to the Sea School, Norfolk, Va., according to an announcement by Captain A. C. Small, District Marine Corps Recruiting Officer, with headquarters at Savannah, Ga.
Upon completion of his initial training at Parris Island, Carraway expressed his desire to compete in examinations for entrance to the United States Naval Academy at Annapolis in 1938, so on January 26, 1937, he was selected to attend the Sea School at Norfolk, preparatory to sea service, a requisite for eligi-

bility to compete for entrance to the Naval Academy, they graduates of which furnish the Navy and Marines most of their officers.
Mr. Carraway is a graduate of the Beaufort High School, class of 1935, and also attended North Carolina State College.
He has many friends here who will learn of his activities with pleasure.
