Drying, curing and canning of foods, picnic and school lunches, meal planning and table decorations and settings for formal and informal occasions are significant in the program.

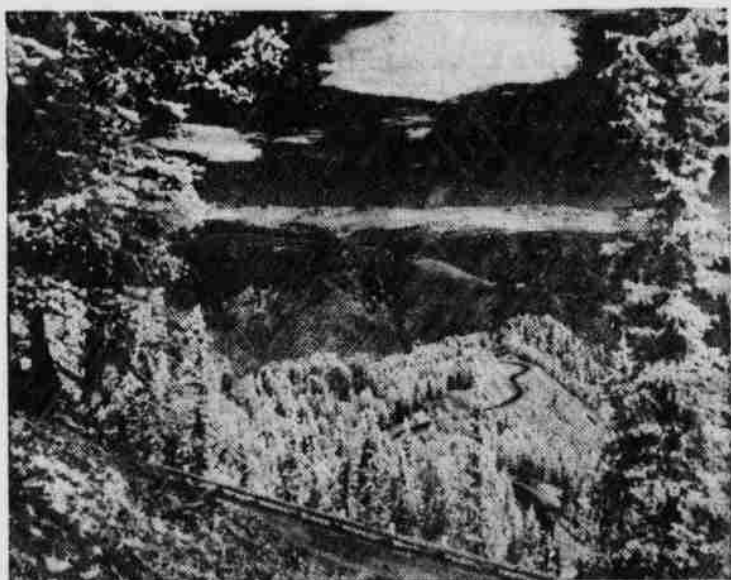

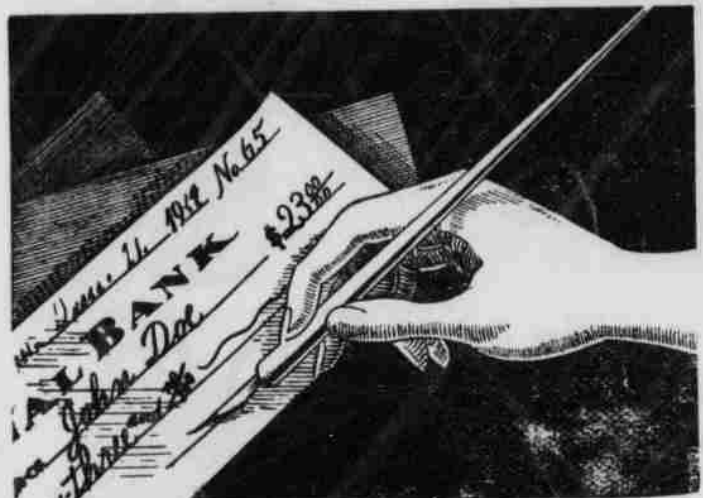
