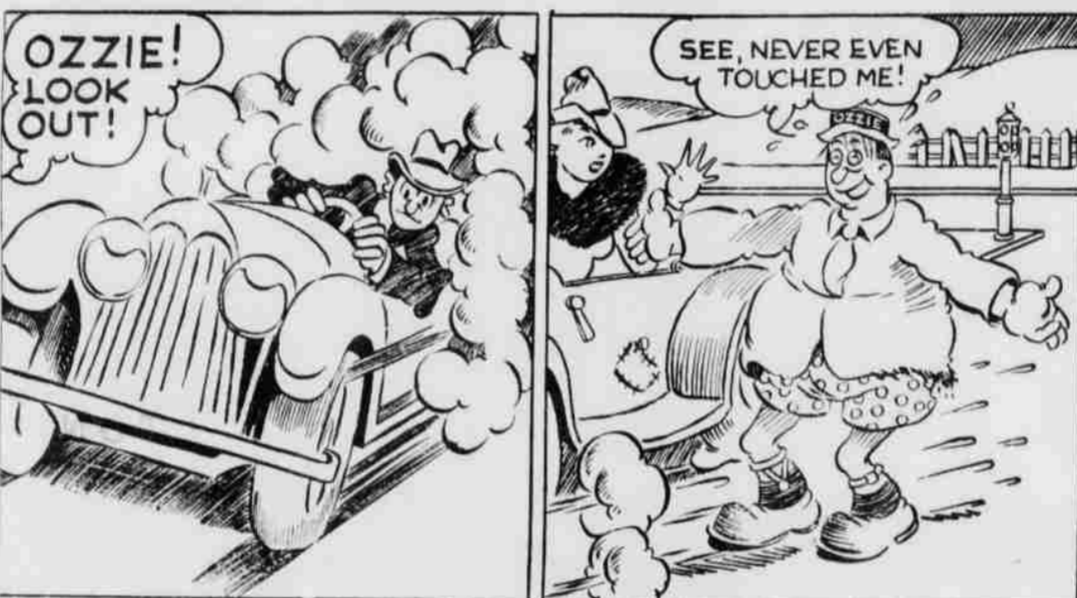
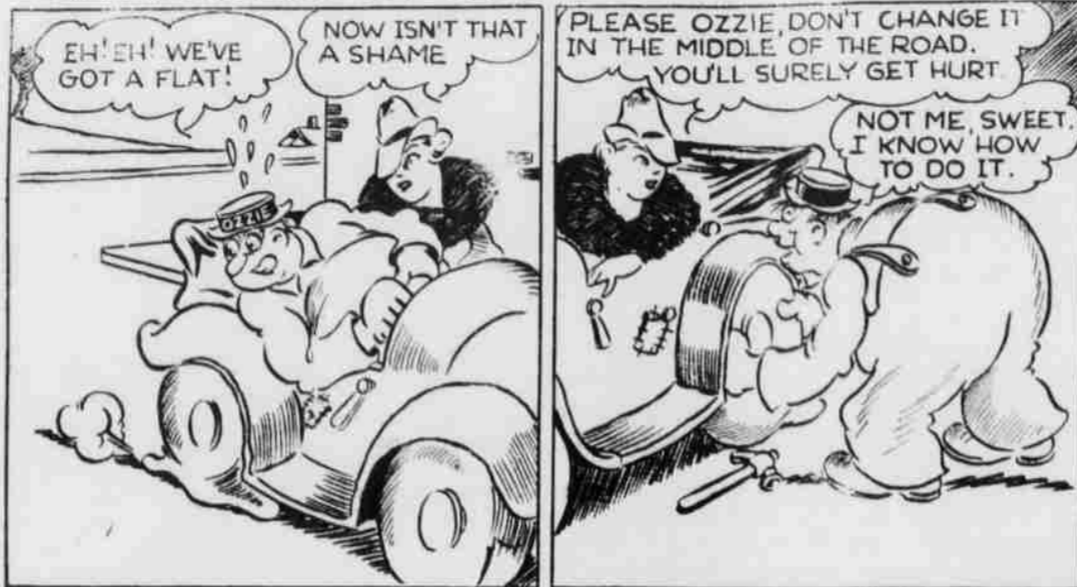

### Institute Suit As Result Of Vessel Sinking Off Coast

A suit by Konstantinos Palaskus, third assistant engineer on the late S. S. Tzenny Chandris of Chios, Greece which sank off Cape Hatteras on November 13th during a southeast gale, asking \$7,300 damages for personal loss and injury was placed on file in Federal court at Norfolk last Saturday, according to a United Press dispatch from that city.

The suit was filed against John Chandris, Piraeus, Greece, owner of the ill-fated vessel, and charges were made that the Tzenny Chandris was unseaworthy and overloaded. The vessel had been loaded with a cargo said by port officials to have been exactly 7,949 tons in Morehead City. She cleared from the local port on Armistice Day about noon, bound for Rotterdam in The Netherlands. It was stated in the Norfolk dispatch that the vessel began listing in the rough seas off Hatteras and finally sank. The actual time of the sinking was just before day break on Saturday, Nov. 13. Twenty-one of the crew of 29 including Capt. George

Componentis, the master, were rescued by either the Coast Guard Cutter Mendotta, or by the Tanker Swiftsure, Coast Guard and Naval aviators first spotted the bodies of the men in the shark infested seas.

### WATER TANK RANGE LIGHT BURNS AGAIN

The range light on the water tank in Beaufort is burning again, after being off for several months. The light only burns when dredging operations are underway in Beaufort Inlet. At the present time the U. S. Dredge Comstock is engaged on the inlet project, restoring the depth across the bar to 30-feet in places where shoaling has occurred. During the day time if anyone happens to look at the location of the light on Beaufort's water tank it looks insignificant. But at night, when dredging operations are underway at the inlet, the light is of vast importance and can be seen clearly at the inlet but much farther away at sea. It is likely that the range light will burn permanently when navigation to and from the port justifies it.
