

Sunday Hunting Is Outlawed In State

County Game Warden Leon Thomas has been advised by his chief in Raleigh, J. D. Chalk, commissioner of game, that effective February 6, Sunday hunting in North Carolina will be outlawed. Anyone violating the law as it regards Sabbath hunting will be subject to arrest and charged with a misdemeanor. The penalty will be a fine or imprisonment or both. This new law will not be popular in Carteret county where Sabbath hunting has long been a custom. The law however is not made by Game Warden Thomas, but instead by the Board of Conservation and Development. It will be Thomas' duty to enforce the law in Carteret and judging from his other activities as a game warden, he will make a good job of his new duty. Sunday fishing is not outlawed, as was erroneously stated in one of the state newspapers recently.

Blue Marlin Tows Yacht 'Carribbean'

A story received in Morehead City clipped from a Fort Lauderdale newspaper recently tells about a blue marlin which was hooked by an angler aboard the yacht "Carribbean II" on the fishing grounds off that Florida city. The huge fish fought for five hours to free itself and finally succeeded, but not until it had towed the boat to waters off Miami. In the meantime the Coast Guard air service was sent in search of the Carribbean II which had failed to come back to Fort Lauderdale. Skipper of the Carribbean II is William "Shy" Fodrie, son of Richard Fodrie in Morehead City.
