**Grand Excursion to Richmond, Va., Nov. 25th.**

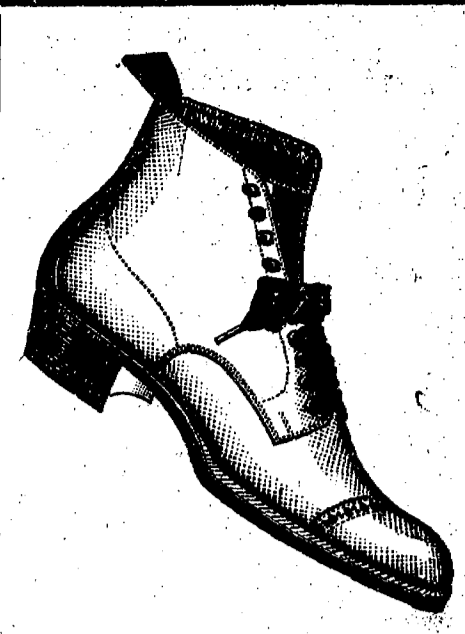
On account of Thanksgiving Game between Universities of North Carolina and Virginia.

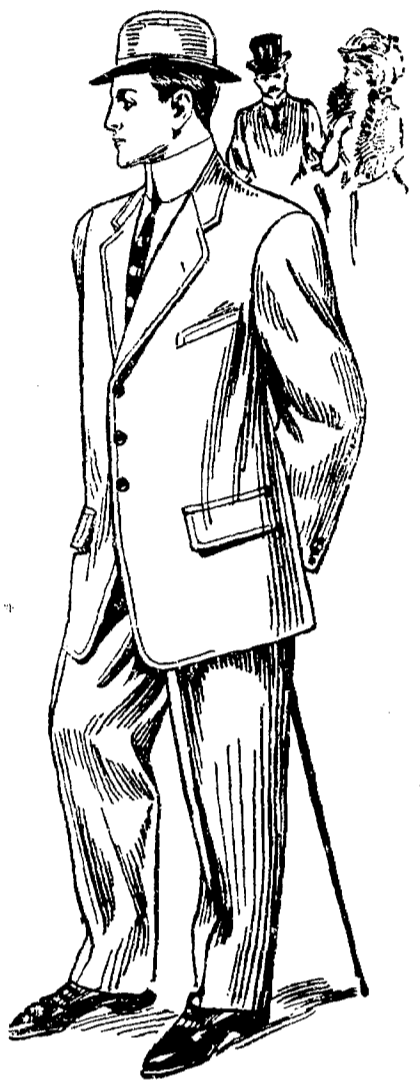
