Barbarous Convict System. Milwaukee Wisconsin.

The prison stockade fire at Centerville, Ala., by which 25 convicts lost their lives, will serve to renew agitation for reform in the convict system of Alabama. The fact that the fatal fire was started by a prisoner as the prelude to a desperate attempt to escape seems like evidence of evil influences within the stockade from which the convicts would flee at any risk.

Alabama's convicts is a disgrace to that state and to the South, in which the leasing of prison labor to tyrannical taskmasters may be regarded as a relic of the feeling toward labor which existed in ante-bellum days and which still lingers in certain prison systems, including the one which has just been luridly advertised to the world.

There is no comparison here with the prison labor systems which have been in vogue in the North, because the northern prisoners have been in charge of the state authorities while serving the various lessees. They have not been leased, but the product of their labor has been thus indirectly purchased. It is a plan vastly different from that of turning over a convict to the mercies of a lessee, who can indulge in brutality between inspections by state officials, and easily discredit all complaints of victims.

President Taft's Success.

The Senate votes on the Railroad Bill assumes President Taft's success on the leading administration measures. The others will follow.

Doubters who thought a month ago that President Taft had lost his grip on affairs can now see that the administration is steadily carrying its policy through Congress with essential change. The vital points of the Railroad Rate Bill have already passed both houses. The Postal Savings Bank Bill has passed the Senate and is before the House, just as the reclamation and statehood measures have passed the House and are before the Senate.

The great department appropriation bills carry out President Taft's policy as a retrenchment, and the additions to the national expenditure proposed in the House still have to be considered in the Senate and must finally be approved by the President.

Progress like this no one expected or anticipated earlier in the season. The House was disorganized. The Republican majority and control in the Senate was challenged. President Taft has allied himself with no faction. He has refused either to accept or reject "old" leaders or "new" leaders. He has acted neither with "regulars" nor "insurgents" as such. He has not shared in the widespread attack on Senator Aldrich or Speaker Cannon. He has wholly refused to accept the retrogressive policy of either and he has been equally unwilling to follow when one "insurgent" or the other led.
