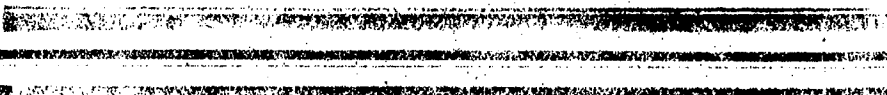

Hurricane Whips Flood Waters

The Mississippi Into Flood

New Orleans, La., May 9.—New Orleans tonight with the severest rain storm in history. All of the lower Louisiana was affected and the people who live behind the already terribly swollen levees that hold back the Mississippi's flood waters are in a fix.

The wind ranged from an hour at New Orleans miles at Baton Rouge, many points along the swept the waves of the stream over the levees.

At New Orleans 5 1/2 in. rain fell from noon until 11 o'clock and about four inches between 7 and 9 o'clock.

Mississippi river here was ed up by the high water rose 8 inches in two hours between 8 and 10 o'clock forcing the waters over the levees at several points.

At 10 o'clock the river at the Canal street registered a foot or one-tenth of a foot more than the predicted stage predicted by the bureau. At 11 o'clock the showed a drop of one-tenth a foot for the hour, but continued to pour down rents at intervals.

Dozens of messages poured to the office of the United States army engineers here to rumored breaks in the levee above New Orleans.
