DEMOCRATIC STATE CONVENTION

Raleigh, June 6.—The nomination of Hon. E. L. Daughtridge of Rocky Mount, for lieutenant governor was snatching victory from what had earlier appeared as defeat. On the third ballot Daniel lacked only 23 votes of election but from that moment the Kitchen-Daniel forces weakened. This is a decisive victory for the Simmons people. The final vote—the fifth ballot—was: Daughtridge, 591.81; Daniel, 278.13; Shaw, 96.15. Daughtridge entered the hall and great applause followed. He made a short speech of acceptance.
With the taking of the fifth ballot the convention became wilder. From Daughtridge men came calls "get on the band wagon." The anti-Kitchen forces were determined to defeat Walter Daniel. The division of the Kitchen-Simmons forces was more evident as the balloting proceeded.
The platform committee has a majority of Simmons men and it is rumored that the few Kitchen men on the committee will make a minority report which will precipitate a row in the convention.
First ballot: Boushall, 103.76; MacRae, 150.36; Daniel, 288.78; Shaw, 228.18; Daughtridge, 193.76. Necessary for a choice, 488.
Second ballot: Boushall, 28.36; MacRae, 122.11; Daniels, 344.68. Great disorder in convention.
Third ballot: Boushall, 268; MacRae, 57.45; Daniel, 453; Shaw, 212.51; Daughtridge, 236.74.
Daniel lacks 28 votes and the convention went into a squabble on the question of adjournment. Roll call taken.
Fourth ballot: Convention voted down motion to adjourn, and as the fourth ballot was begun MacRae withdrew. Pandemonium reigned in the convention for a long period. The Kitchen people are chief supporters of Daniels, who has been on the floor of the convention most of the evening. Relays to the lunch counters are the order of the convention at this period.
Daughtridge made big gains. His followers are making a superb fight. Result: Daniel, 333.40; Shaw, 204.20; Daughtridge, 355.93. Necessary for a choice, 482.
E. L. Travis, of Halifax, was nominated on the first ballot over S. G. Daniel, of Warren, to succeed himself for the short term as corporation commissioner. The vote stood: Travis, 556; Daniel, 368; Bagwell, 32.
George Pell, of Forsyth, was nominated on first ballot for the long term corporation commissioner. Pell received 507 votes; Maxwell, 215; Justice, 205.
The expected clash between the Kitchen and Simmons forces came with the report of the resolutions committee over a section which "indorsed the record of our senators and representatives in Congress and the administration of our governor and state officers."

Following the reading of the majority report by Cameron Morrison, Judge J. S. Manning, for the Kitchen people, presented a minority report declaring that the question of indorsement of the record of Simmons and Kitchen was a question for the voters of the state to decide and the convention should not attempt to prejudice the action of the voters. Manning offered a substitute in the words: "We indorse the record of the democratic party in the state and the nation." Morrison took the floor in behalf of the majority report and asked for fair play and justice.
The Kitchen forces attempted to prevent Morrison from speaking, but he gallantly stood his ground. "If F. M. Simmons is not a Democrat, who is he? The Kitchenites believe that only a Kitchen man has a right to hold office."

"Yes, he voted for Lorimer," shouted the speaker, walking toward the Kitchen people, "but that was not half as bad as trying to fuse with Marion Butler. If the Democratic party cannot indorse the record of its senators representatives and state officers how can we expect the people to do so in November. The question is larger than Kitchen or Simmons."

Simmons has a record indorsed by the people of the senate who understand him best. Simmons has never rated against a measure which emanated from a Democratic source.
"We want to stand by Webb, Page, Doughton, and all the Democrats. I wish you had temper enough for me to discuss the Lorimer case. That was a judicial case, and if Simmons was an honest man he should decide it as he sees fit. He voted for a reopening of the case and before this case was finally disposed of you Kitchen people began to condemn a judge before the evidence was in. Every Kitchen man quakes in his boots fearing that Simmons will vote to turn Lorimer out."
