There were, in 1901, widows below the age 95,798 between the age and ten; 275,862 between and fifteen; 522,867 between and twenty; 938,272 between twenty and thirty; 2,267,361 between thirty-five and forty-five; 2,264,038 between forty-five and fifty; 1,521,210 between fifty and sixty; and 6,596,929 over.
