To Mark Graves Of All Confederates

Washington, Nov. 22.--So far
as an earnest and careful search
by one their own leaders on the
field of battle can assure, every
Confederate soldier and sailor
who died in a Northern prison
and was buried nearby now lies
beneath a headstone or monu-
ment of marble. Gen. James
H. Berry, ex-Senator from Ark-
ansas, the only surviving mem-
ber of the commission entrusted
by Congress with the task has
just reported the completion of
his work to the Secretary of war.

The suggestion that the
National Government mark these
long-neglected graves came
originally from the late Presi-
dent McKinley in the course of
one of his speeches delivered in
the South and took form in an
act of Congress of March 9, 1916.
This appropriated \$200,000 for
marking the graves and created
a commission to do the work.

In the past six years two com-
missioners, ex-Representative
Elliot of South Carolina, and
Governor Coates of Alabama, have
passed away and it has remained
for General Berry, one of the
few living Confederate Generals
to carry out the work.
