What is News?

(From The Yale Review.)

If news is that which is unusual, then a newspaper is justified in publishing the fact that a cow has given birth to a two-headed calf, writes Maurice Law. To determine what interests to general public and therefore, is to be regarded as news, is more difficult and will be determined by the character and the mind of the man in authority. Every person reads a newspaper for the things he is most interested in; he may skim an issue of the newspaper, but he will read only those things that really make their appeal. The man who is more interested in the prize ring than he is in the proceedings of Congress will think his newspaper very dull and very uninteresting if it puts a great debate on the first page and buries the doings of the latest white hope in one of the inside pages.

In this typical illustration is the question that every editor must answer: What has the greater news value, the congressional debate or the white hope?—and that means, which will interest the largest number of readers? If there are more persons to whom the prize ring is of higher consequence than a law affecting the welfare of society, then considered purely from the standpoint of business, the editor is justified in giving the place of honor to the prize ring and letting the debate find a place if it can. The editor would assert that the people were interested in "current news" and that he was very properly satisfying their demand, but I maintain that the public interest in so-called "current news" is no proof of intelligence; rather it may be held that it is positive proof not of intelligence but of a very low order of intellect.
