Quits Legal Grave.

From the legal grave he has occupied for twenty years Henry Schick arose in Belleville, Ill., to spend Easter with his son, Geo. Schick, a member of the Board of Supervisors.

A blending of the experiences of Enoch Arden and Rip Van Winkle, says The St. Louis Republic could have produced a result scarcely more weird and strange than the real life drama of the 74 years old hermit who is visiting his former home for the first time in twenty eight years and who was pronounced legally dead in the Probate Court of Belleville twenty years ago.

Seven years after his departure during which interval he had purposely kept his whereabouts secret. Mrs. Schick asked the Probate Court to have his property divided among the heirs. Her petition was granted and an order entered pronouncing Schick legally dead.

Some years later Mrs. Schick married John Werkmeister. Her second husband died in 1903 and Mrs. Schick died last May.

About six months ago George Schick received a letter from his father explaining his strange disappearance.

The son went to Colorado and induced his father to return to Belleville for a least a visit. He has not yet decided whether he will make his home there, however, having acquired an attachment for his mountain retreat. A reception to old family friends was held at the son's home last night at which Schick senior was guest of honor.

Wilson Will Receive First Pay Check Today.

Washington March 30.—Woodrow Wilson will receive his first pay check as President of the United States tomorrow, when Secretary McAdoo will present him with a treasury warrant for \$5,625, representing his salary from March 4 to 31. On pay day hereafter, however, the President will receive \$6,250, a full month's proportion of his \$75,000 annual salary. The Treasury Department contemplates establishing a precedent in the method of paying President Wilson. Since the days of Washington, the President has been paid by what is known as an "accountable warrant" which closes an account has been given the President only on his last pay day when his services are debited on the books against the credits which have been made to him during his term of office. Mr. Wilson however probably will be given a "warrant" each month and his salary account with Government balanced monthly as his term transpires. No one today knows why the President always has been paid by an "accountable warrant" which is issued in other cases only in connection with advanced money. The President is the only official whose salary is paid directly by the Treasury Department. Vice President Marshall will receive from the Secretary of the Senate tomorrow the portion he has so far earned of his \$12,000 annual commensuration.

Suicide By Throwing Himself on a Saw.

Mr. E. F. Wicker, of Albright township, committed suicide some days ago by throwing himself in front of a circular saw at a saw mill, being instantly killed. Some time ago he had been discharged from the State Hospital where he had been under treatment for insanity.—Chatham Record.
