Richmond, Va., April 10.—Problems affecting the welfare of young girls were discussed at the fourth biennial convention of the Young Women's Christian Association here today. How the association hopes to deal with them briefly explained by Miss Mabel Cratty, general secretary of the national board.

"Two things with which we contend," said Miss Cratty, "are conditions and sin, and there is a constant interplay between these two factors. We must make the conditions under which women live safe; we must educate their sense of values and help them to get their bearings among the circumstances of modern life."
