TAR HEELS SECURE \$45,000 FOR WAR AGAINST PELLAGRA

Washington, D. C., May 9.

—A resolution by the North Carolina Medical Society, followed
by a letter from Dr. W. S. Ranin to Congressman Faison, backed by that representative's efforts, was responsible for an appropriation of \$45,000 by Congress for the study of pellagra in the United States by medical experts. The appropriation was included in the sundry civil hill which passed the Senate Wednesday. The entire message had been vetoed by President Taft, for a reason of connection with the pellagra appropriation, but came through the Senate a second time unscathed.
