In a room which the janitor finds it difficult to bring above sixty degrees Fahrenheit, there are dozens of girls clad in lingerie waist, low neck, and elbow-sleeves, minus any under-vest except and apology for one made of the thinnest gauze. Their feet are arrayed in low shoes, with embroidered silk stockings. When they leave the school room for home, a thin jacket to match the skirt is donned, and, in some cases, no covering for the head.
