SPECIAL SESSION OF LEGISLATURE CALLED BY GOVERNOR CRAIG

Raleigh, N. C., July 18. — Governor Craig will leave tomorrow morning for Asheville N. C. for a short stay. The constitutional amendment commission having completed its labors, Governor Craig decided to issue a call for the special session of the legislature. The call of course, takes the form of a proclamation by the Governor and requests legislators to reassemble on September 24. It is noteworthy that the first purpose designated by the governor in calling the legislature into extra session relates to the subject of freight rates. The proclamation follows:

By and with the advice of the Council of State, I, Locke Craig, Governor of the State of North Carolina, in the exercise of the power conferred upon me by the Constitution and in accordance with the resolution passed by the General Assembly and ratified on the 6th day of February, 1913, do issue this my proclamation on this extraordinary occasion, convening, the General Assembly in Extra Session. I do, therefore, notify and request the Senators and the Members of the House of Representatives of the General Assembly of North Carolina to meet in their respective halls, in the Capitol in the City of Raleigh, on the 24th day of September, 1913, at 11 o'clock A. M. for the following specified purposes:

1. To provide for the people of North Carolina just transportation rates and to adjust the relations and obligations between the State of North Carolina and the railroads operating within the territory of this State.

2. To receive the report of the Constitutional Commission and to consider the submission to the people of amendments to the Constitution.

In Witness Whereof, I, Locke Craig, Governor and Commander-in-Chief, have hereunto set my hand, and caused the Great Seal of the State to be affixed.

Done in our City of Raleigh, this 18th day of July, in the Year of Our Lord, one thousand nine hundred and thirteen and in the 137th year of our Independence.

Referring to the call of the extra session of the legislature, Governor Craig said:

"The last legislature passed a resolution providing for an extra session of the general assembly in order that amendments to the constitution might be submitted to the people. The general assembly created a Constitutional commission to prepare such amendments and report them to the governor. This commission has completed its work. An extra session of the general assembly is therefore necessary." Continuing, he said:

"The negotiations between the representatives of the railroads and the corporation commission have not in my opinion resulted in any understanding sufficient definite to delay the call of the extra session.

"These negotiations will not be interfered with by this call, and before the meeting of the general assembly on the 24th of September, there is ample time in which to arrive at an agreement. I earnestly hope that there will be an amicable adjustment of our differences with the railroads.

Moose Party Still Lives.

Washington, July 15. —George N. Wise, a prominent young lawyer of Newport News, Va., who was a candidate as a regular Republican in 1910 for the seat in Congress held for the past 13 years by the Honorable William A. Jones, but went over to the "Bull Moose" in the last Presidential campaign, declared his continued allegiance to the new organization when seen here today. Asked what he thought of the present political situation, the Republican "get together" effort was particularly discussed.

Mr. Wise expressed the opinion that the Republican party could never "come back" in its old form in the Southern States, and that the only hope of a vigorous and healthy opposition to the Democracy in that section lay in the "Progressive" Republican movement, which undertakes to safeguard the principal of Caucasian control at home against interference from elsewhere. In elucidating this point, Mr. Wise continued: "I don't think the South realizes the meaning and far reaching effect of the party plan of organization of the progressives. I mean Democrats and Democratic papers especially. On suffrage it stands squarely for States rights by providing that certificates of delegates to its conventions signed by the primary law, or by the State Committee if there is no primary law, shall be conclusive with the Nation Committee. The party leaders are encouraged to be locally worthy of confidence by the increase of representations when they increase the Progressive vote.
