The First Impeached Governor.

William Sulzer stands as the first Governor impeached and removed from office in the history of the United States. Impeachments in the separate states have been very rare, and for the most part have been brought against judges.

Before the United States Senate since the formation of the Government there have been but nine impeachment trials, and of these but three resulted in conviction. The first to be convicted was John Pickens, a Judge of the Federal Court for the District of New Hampshire, who was impeached for making decisions contrary to the law and for drunkenness and profanity on the bench. The second conviction was of Judge W. W. Humphries, of the District Court of Tennessee, in the turbulent year of 1863. His offense consisted of making a speech in favor of secession and accepting a judicial office under the Confederate Government. The third and last conviction was in the recent case of Judge Archbald, of the Commerce Court.

Samuel Chase an Associate Justice of the United States Supreme Court, was impeached in 1805 for misconduct in his office, but was acquitted after a stormy trial. Prior to this case it had been held that only such offenses as were indictable at law could be the basis of impeachment proceedings. But the House of Representatives in impeaching President Johnson took the view that any act would warrant impeachment that was highly prejudicial to the public welfare or subversive of any essential principle of government. —Philadelphia Press.

Levy Jokes About Death

As the End Nears

At times Isaac Levy, the clothing merchant who swallowed four bichloride of mercury tablets in his Brooklyn home Sunday night, jokes about the death that is slowly creeping over him. At other times he is melancholy with the realization that he can't live many more days. He is cheerful when any member of his family comes to his bedside in the Sunshine Sanitarium and Rest Home at Cropsey avenue and Bay Thirty-fifth street, Bath Beach.

The dying man's home at 8835 Twenty-second avenue, Bath Beach, is a house of death. His eleven children, six of whom are married where there yesterday. They admitted that their father's death was inevitable and that all they could do was to wait for it.

It is believed that Levy may die to-morrow or the next day, for the four tablets of poison he took in mistake for headache tablets, are enough to kill four men. He may live a week or more, but Dr. Jacob Sarnoff is doubtful.

Levy is 59 years old. For years he did a big wholesale clothing business in downtown New York. He had an office and seven lots on Fourth street for years, and many of the young men who graduated from his business are now heads of other establishments.

Of recent years Mr. Levy has had a smaller place of business at 28 East Tenth street, for he lost a lot of money in 1907. He used to give a great deal to charity—to Beth Israel hospital and to other institutions—and was accounted rich. But he has made no win since he swallowed the mercury tablets, said members of his family yesterday, because he no longer is rich. He is a thirty-third degree Mason.

Mrs. Levy, grief-stricken and heart-weary, went to her husband's bedside yesterday.

"Don't worry," he told her, and patted her head. "I'm all right. I'll be out in a few days and over town again."

But Mrs. Levy knew better and the crying must have known he wasn't telling the truth.

Benjamin Levy, a married son, who lives at 1205 Longfellow avenue, had come out to see his father at three o'clock yesterday afternoon when Levy had come out of coma into consciousness. The father reached out his hand to his son.

"You haven't got long they say, dad," said the son.

"Yes I have," replied his father. "Don't worry. I'll be alright in a few days."

"They say you haven't got a fighting chance."

"Don't worry. I'm alright. How's your boy, Ben?"

"Fine replied the son. "Shall I bring him over?"

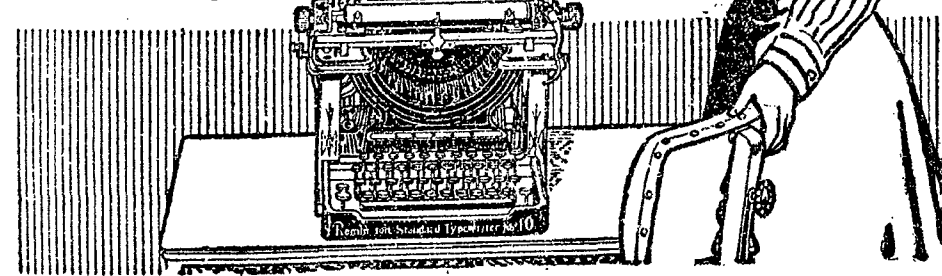
