The dispatch of the fleet created only mild excitement in the national anital generally. Newspapers ordered their representatives to Lampton Roads, and tonight the Navy Department granted permission to 20 reporters and photographers to accompany the fleet on its cruise.

It will be fully a week before the Atlantic Fleet is assembled at Tampico, though the ships are expected to se steaming away tomorrow. Rear Admiral Badger will rank both Admiral Fletcher and Rear Admiral Mayo, and will take complete charge of the situation.

While the ships are under way. General Huecta will have about a week in which to answer the American demands.


