Will Harris, the noted criminal, who has thrice given the officers of this county the slip, has been located in Atlanta, where he is now serving a term of imprisonment for counterfeiting. Harris' term will not expire before 1904 and Sheriff Wallace has notified the Georgia officials that Mecklenburg would like to have a chance at him.

It will be recalled that Harris escaped from the county jail by digging through the wall. While at the convict camp he made his escape twice. He is said to be guilty of numerous crimes and is an all-round bad man.
