#### FIRE IN OIL MILL.

Negro Man Takes a Few Cuts in Preference to Being Burned to Death. Last night at about half past six o'clock fire broke out in the Oliver Oil Mill. The fire did very little other damage, only "sweepin' up de flo' " as Tom expressed it.
