

Yesterday In The Legislature

THE SENATE—MONDAY. The senate met at 12 o'clock. Rev. Wm. McG. White, of the First Presbyterian church, offered prayer.

Senator Sikes, of Wake, offered a resolution authorizing the board of public buildings and grounds to have Blount street paved in front of the governor's mansion. Referred to the committee on public buildings and grounds.

Bills Introduced. Reinhardt, of Lincoln: Providing for punishment for making false statements to obtain credit. Judiciary.

Rascoe, of Bertie: Amending road law of Bertie; also amending game law of Bertie.

Parham, of Wayne: Preserve record of Wayne county. Judiciary.

Johnson, of Duplin: Facilitate the probate of wills by non-residents in certain cases. Revisal.

Bills From the House. Bills were received from the house as follows and referred to appropriate committees:

Allow commissioners of Alleghany county to levy a special tax for building a new court house.

Authorize the mayor and commissioners of Rutherfordton to refund bonded indebtedness falling due August, 1910.

Authorize commissioners of Stokes to apply surplus taxes levied and collected.

Amendment authorizing a bond issue by Hickory.

Ratify an election at Murphy, Cherokee county, for \$25,000 of waterworks and sewer bonds.

Relating to jury fees before justices of the peace in Johnson county.

Protect game in Gaston county.

Allow county commissioners to make appropriation for farm demonstration work.

Regulate fishing and hunting in Burke county.

Protect wild turkeys in Swain county.

Promote growing live stock in Beaufort county.

Protect rainbow trout in Graham county.

Attend law relative to hunting deer in Dare county.

Amend the law relating to selling cattle on the range.

Amend the law relative to the time for hunting 'possums in Sampson county.

Amend the law fixing the time for hunting quail in Sampson.

Relative to the time for holding courts in Sampson.

Providing an additional term of court for Scotland.

Amending the law providing a squirrel law for Perquimans county.

Providing a four and a half fence law in Perquimans.

Establish commissioners of Martin to appoint committees to make contracts for the county and to inspect work done under such contracts.

For the relief of Miss Maudie Berry, court stenographer of Macon county.

Providing for the appointment of a court stenographer in Macon.

Providing that a majority of qualified voters shall hold stock law election in Macon.

Relative to the service of summons.

Mr. Page invited to speak.

The senate adopted a joint resolution inviting Logan W. Page to address the general assembly on good roads in the hall of the house Thursday evening, January 15th.

The bill relative to fishing in Albemarle Sound was reported favorably and passed second and third readings.

Senator Carpenter, of Gaston, was allowed to withdraw his bill appointing Ed. C. Ray a justice of the peace in Gaston county.

The senate adjourned at 12:20 as a tribute to the memory of the late Col. W. J. Hicks.

The senate meets again Tuesday at 11 o'clock.

THE HOUSE—MONDAY. Representative Dowd, of Alleghany, presided for the session of the house today in the absence of Speaker Dowd, convening the session at noon. Petitions presented included one by Battle, of Wake, relative to the History of North Carolina, by Capt. S. A. Ashe; McGill, of Cumberland, from the Daughters of the Confederacy, endorsing the movement for a home for wives and widows of Confederate veterans; by Kellum, of New Hanover, from women of the Cape Fear asking for a monument to Confederates.

New Bills Introduced. McGill, of Cumberland: Erect a women's building at the North Carolina Soldier's Home for wives and widows of veterans, and appropriating \$3,000 for building and \$5,000 for maintenance.

Battle, of Wake: Joint resolution for paving the streets about the governor's mansion.

Kent, of Caldwell: Protect women from incompetent midwives.

Bethel, of Rowan: Protect sheep raising. Also concerning pensions of Confederate soldiers.

Dillard, of Cherokee: Incorporate Marble, in Cherokee county.

Herbert, of Clay: Amend road law of Clay county.

Parham, of Davidson: Tax laundry wagons in Lexington.

Provide for payment of costs of defense in Johnson county.

Supply records of grants in Moore county.
