Wake Forest, Jan. 24.—By defeating Guilford College at basket ball Saturday night Wake Forest retained its record of never having been defeated on its home floor with the exception of once last year when the Columbus (Ga.) Y. M. C. A. team defeated them and at the same time made a telling stride toward the state championship of colleges, which she has held for the last fifteen years, Charlotte being the state champions.

The game Saturday was fast, snappy and hard fought from beginning to end. Guilford went in the game confident of winning owing to their victories over Portsmouth (107-18) and Davidson (68-22). Wake Forest went in for revenge over last year's defeat. Guilford started the game off with a field goal and from then on it was exceedingly close. The first half ended 9-8 in Wake Forest's favor. Frequent disputes marked the game throughout. The second half was harder fought than the first, but like the first it also ended 9-8 in Wake Forest's favor. The total score being 18-16 in favor of Wake Forest.

The particular stars for Wake Forest were Dowd and Beam while Benbow starred for Guilford. Dowd's playing at guard against Benbow was some of the best seen here, he holding him down to four field goals against ten while playing Davidson and seventeen against Portsmouth. 
