Insurrectos Completely Control Situation--Associated Press Man Interviews Leaders--Tales of Fighting and Death Brought in by Correspondents

By Associated Press. General Luque with less than 100 men occupies Ojinaga and Colonel Dorantes with about 200 cavalry it at Cuachillo Parrado.

Interviews Leader.

The Associated Press correspondent interviewed Jose de La Cruz Sanchez last night. "We could take Ojinaga at any time," he said.

Made False Start.

A party of thirty rurales rode out from Ojinaga this morning but sighting the insurrectos about three miles from town, they immediately returned to the fortified camp.

Poited to A. P. Men.

Two days ago the Associated Press correspondent and a Mexican guide encountered a party of seven gen darmes on the American side of the river.

Federal Cooped Up.

The column under Colonel Dorantes which recently was defeated with heavy loss near Coyame is again attacked by the insurgents near Boquillita, about 25 miles from Cuachillo Parrado.

100 Killed in Battle.

Colonel Dorantes attempted to return to Ojinaga with his cavalry and two machine guns over the mountain trails last week. He was driven back into Coyame with a loss of more than 100 killed by the insurrectos under Jose de La Cruz Sanchez and T. Orega.

Federal Driven Back.

A detachment of about 50 insurrectos has been camped on the river front about thirty miles above this point. Last night a courier from Sanchez arrived and the detachment left at daybreak for the scene of action.

Fight Near Border.

For a time last night it was believed that Ojinaga was being attacked by the insurrectos. The sound of firing continued on Page Nine.
