R. R. COMMITTEE GR. CHAR. CLUB MEETS FRIDAY

There will be an important meeting tomorrow at 1:30 o'clock in the offices of the Greater Charlotte Club at the Selwyn hotel, for the purpose of hearing the first report of the committee working on the Norwood-Charlotte railway proposition. It will be remembered that at the recent visit here of the gentlemen from Stanley county a committee of three was appointed from the Greater Charlotte club and three from the Business Men's Club of Norwood, to canvass the situation thoroughly and report at their earliest convenience as to the outlook for the early construction of the road.

The committees have done their work most thoroughly and are very enthusiastic over the outlook. An experienced railroad man has been over the entire proposed route of the road and gives as his opinion that the road can be constructed at a cost of not less than \$20,000 per mile and not over \$25,000. No actual survey has been made, but the engineer, who is a very competent and experienced builder of roads, is convinced that the road could not cost over \$25,000 per mile to construct. But the most important thing in connection with the meeting will be the presence of two railroad men whose names are not yet given out, but who have been attracted by the Norwood-to-Charlotte project and who may take a hand in building the road. The result of the meeting will be watched with interest. It is predicted that a railroad connecting Charlotte and Norwood is a strong probability for the near future. The gentlemen appointed by President C. O. Kuester of the Greater Charlotte Club, to look after the interests of the movement at this end of the line are Messrs. D. P. Hutchison, chairman, M. C. Mayer and C. G. Creighton, from the city, and Messrs. N. S. Alexander and J. R. Henderson of the county.

Programme Of Olympic Games

Chicago, March 2.-The program for the Olympic games to be held at Stockholm, Sweden, next year, was made public here today. Many events unfamiliar to American athletes are on the card. New conditions for instance, govern the javelin throw and the shot put. In addition to the free throw, there will be thrown by the left and the right hands alternately. The Swedes and Germans are said to be adepts at this style but it is sure to be a handicap to most of the Americans. Competition will start June 30, with lawn tennis and target shooting. On July 7 the real athletic competitions will begin with the 100 metre race. The big event of the meet-the Marathon race-will be run July 15. The distance has been made 24.85 miles instead of the regulation 26 miles 385 yards.
