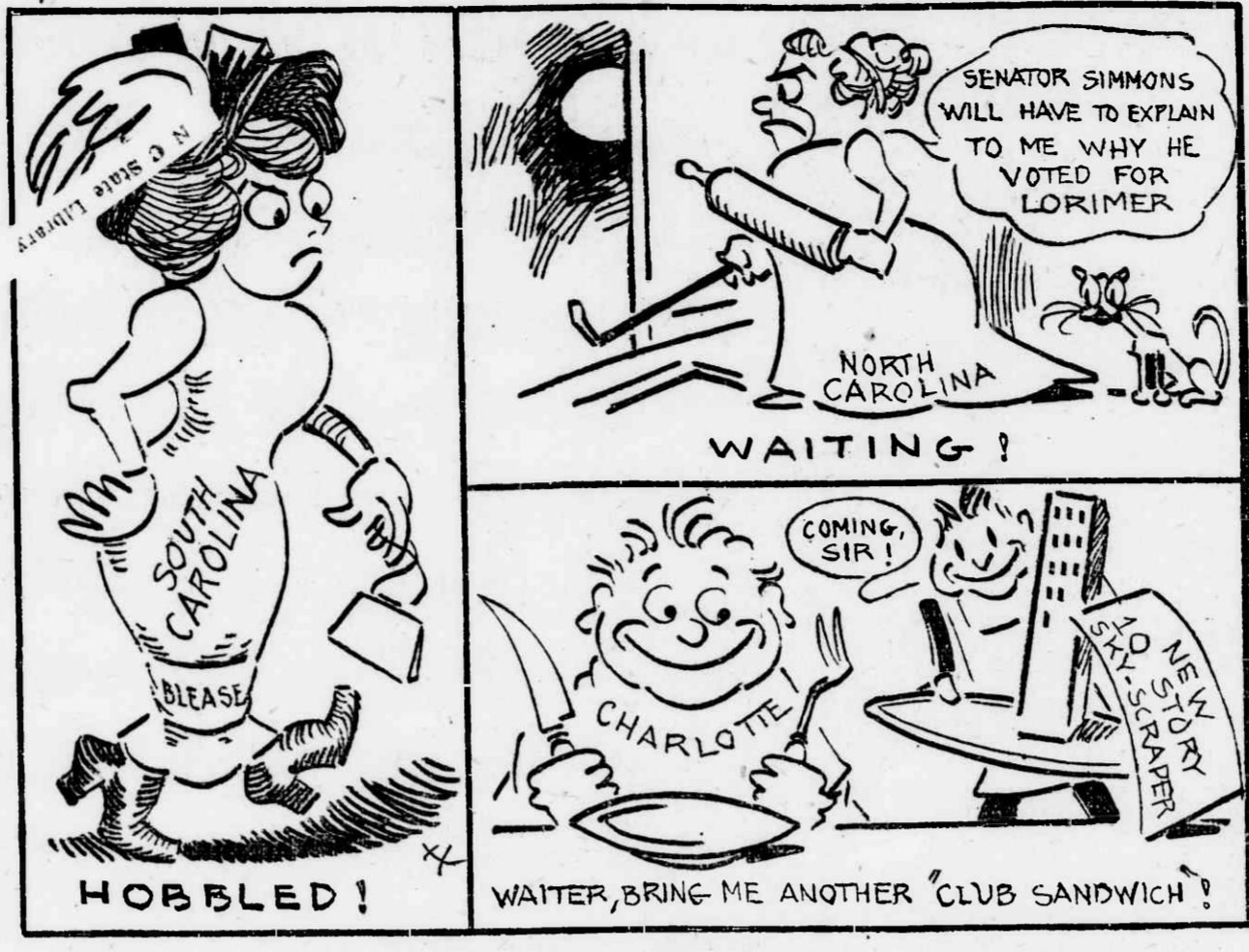

Washington, March 3.—Shortly after two o'clock, during consideration of the postage bill, which followed passage of the naval appropriation bill, Senator Penrose announced an abandonment of the proposition to increase the postal rates of magazines. Opponents of the measure had indicated their intention to "talk it to death" and its withdrawal evidently was made in the interest of facilitating other legislation.

Mr. Latta Buys More Tryon St. Dirt

Adding to his territorial possessions on South Tryon street, Mr. E. D. Latta, yesterday bought from Mr. Joseph H. Wear, of East Seventh street, the house and lot, corner of Tryon and Stone wall streets, at present occupied by Mr. D. W. Oates and family. The deed was passed between 5 and 6 o'clock yesterday afternoon. The consideration was \$15,000. By this last purchase Mr. Latta now owns three blocks and a half of South Tryon street property, with the exception of the Harty lot and Mr. W. W. Ward's.
