By Associated Press. Chicago, Ill., March 17.-The probability of the Illinois legislature passing a bill allowing six round boxing matches created a stir in local pugilistic circles last night.

The bill in question was introduced at Springfield yesterday by Senator John E. Madigan, of Chicago. The main provisions of the bill are: Bouts of six rounds duration. No decision to be rendered. Principals to be over the age of 18 years.

Must pass physical examination. Exhibitions must be held before bona fide chartered athletic clubs. Gloves to be of no less than six ounces. The match maker of the club organization to be a thorough, experienced judge of athletes and capable of making proper matches.

The ring to be not less than 16 feet square and to be of the makeshift type. No prizes or purses to be awarded to the contestants.

Mr. Corwith Returns From Trip to Lenoir

Mr. W. T. Corwith returned yesterday from Lenoir, where he was invited by the recently reorganized board of trade of that city to make an address on "The Advantages of Municipal Advertising." He went up to Lenoir on Wednesday and made the address before the Lenoirians on Wednesday night.

Mr. Corwith says he was the recipient of a very cordial reception and that everything was done that could be done to make his visit a pleasant one. He enjoyed the trip immensely. He says that he found Lenoir a wide-awake and attractive city, situated in a beautiful country, 20 miles from Blowing Rock, and thoroughly alive to capturing its share of the tourist and permanent population that is coming to the South so rapidly of late years.

The town has made a gain of 150 per cent in population during the last 10 years, the per cent being based on a population of the last census at 3,500. This figure, however, hardly gives correctly an impression of the size of the place for the reason that a large part of the population is to be found outside of the corporate limits and surrounding a number of elegant factories devoted to the making of cotton goods. An excellent tannery, several large wood-working plants are also outside the city limits.

Mr. Corwith was impressed with the facilities and natural attractions of Lenoir as a summer resort and thinks both climate and elevation ideal.
