Therefore, as in the beginning, it behooves us to speak tonight or forever afterwards hold our peace."

After delivering this very eloquent and explanatory address the alderman (he has no opposition for re-election) said that he could not tarry longer, but must converse with others who were anxiously waiting to hear from him. But if any one imagined for a minute that the only and original rally was

to be held this evening, a great mistake was made, for there has been individual rallies all the day.


Local Y. M. C. A. Boys At Kannapolis
